FIRE SAFETY TIPS

DON'T FORGET ABOUT YOUR SMOKE DETECTORS

When the time comes to Spring Forward or Fall Back don't forget to change the batteries in all of your smoke detectors.

BEWARE OF CARBON MONOXIDE

Carbon Monoxide is an odorless, colorless and potentially lethal gas. Protect your family with carbon monoxide detectors.

ADOPT A FIRE HYDRANT

Remember to keep your nearest hydrant clear of cars, snow, vegetation & debris. This will allow firefighters to easily access the hydrant in times of emergency.

REMEMBER TO POST YOUR ADDRESS CLEARLY

Precious minutes can be lost when we can't locate the address of an emergency. Post your house number clearly on your mailbox or home.

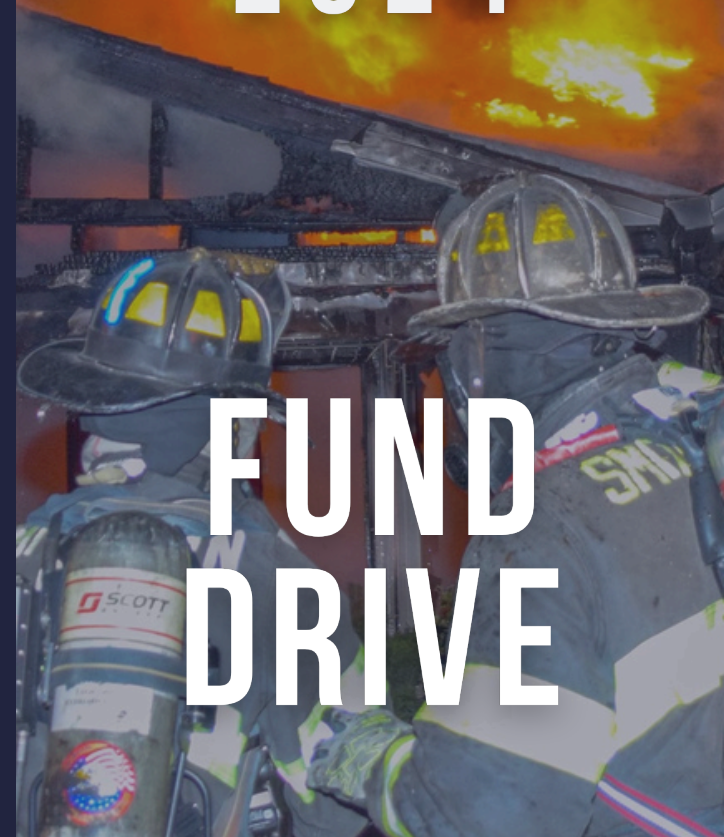

LITHIUM ION BATTERY SAFETY TIPS

- DO NOT KEEP CHARGING THE DEVICE BATTERY AFTER IT IS FULLY CHARGED.
- STOP USING BATTERY IF YOU NOTICE THESE PROBLEMS: *ODOR, CHANGE IN COLOR, TOO MUCH HEAT, CHANGE IN SHAPE, LEAKING OR ODD NOISES.*
- DO NOT PUT LITHIUM ION BATTERIES IN THE TRASH OR DISCARD IN PILES.
- STORE BATTERIES AWAY FROM ANYTHING THAT CAN CATCH FIRE.
